Provide grading demonstrations, instructions and guidance to industry. Conduct or direct investigations in all functional areas, involving knowledge of specific commodities, production processes, shipping facilities and services, marketing operations and other pertinent conditions influencing the quality and condition of agricultural products. Also perform a broad range of independent work as described below for journeyman inspector.
